Presentation by Jeovanny Rodriguez. Scope consists of installation of a lighting system to illuminate the playground. The project is estimated at \$56,000, out of which \$31,000 is from HD funds.

Board Member Lambert requested that the board be provided with the master plan for the park in terms of lighting and potentially saving money.

Chair Solares requested that the board be provided an itemized list for this project.

#### **IV. PROJECT UPDATES:**

- 1. Duarte Park Building Renovations, Splash Park and Sign Construction Services Completed: Presentation by Jeovanny Rodriguez. Scope of project is the expansion of the recreational building; including the demolition of a terrace and a construction of an 800 square feet addition for the multi-purpose room; including update to electrical system; the renovation of the existing building; new park manager's office and new lighting for the new facilities. Total project scope of the total allocated funds for the project: \$1,321,797, out of which \$752,797 were HD (Homeland Defense) funds. Total project cost: \$1,268,834. Total savings: \$43,963.
- 2. West End Park New Community Building: Presentation by Jeovanny Rodriguez. This project is 90 percent designed, currently in the dry run process for permitting. Scope of project is demolition of existing community building and construction of the new 10,800 square feet community building. The new building would include multi-purpose room, fitness room, activity rooms, computer room, break rooms, male and female restrooms, a covered terrace and picnic area. Total estimated cost: \$3,878,537, out of which \$1,980,521 are HD funds. This is a project that is going to be conventional bid; expect to be ready for advertisement by end of March 2014 and start construction in August 2014.
- 3. Bryan Park Tennis/Community Center Design Services. Presentation by Jeovanny Rodriguez. The scope of this project is the demolition of 600 square feet comfort station and construction of new 1,500 square feet community building and upgrade FPL services to the park. Total cost estimate: \$871,611, out of which \$852,128 is HD funds. This project is 90 percent complete in design; currently in dry run process for permitting. Project is expected to be advertised at the end of March 2014 with estimated construction start of August 2014.

Board Member Lambert stated that he and the community have always had a concern about the placement based on the rendering; there has always been an issue each time they see a rendering of where the project is going, the feeling is that it's always encroaching into the green space too much. He further suggested the community may be okay with the present placement because this is preserving the green space, but from the rendering in the update, it looks different. Board Member Lambert suggested that the site plan and the rendering do not

match, but as long as the project is proceeding as reflected in the site plan, he concurs with the site plan, but that is not what was in the update provided to the board.

Mr. Rodriguez expressed his understanding of the community's concern, and he is aware that this issue was discussed by the board at a previous meeting. He stated from his department's perspective, there was a discussion had with the Parks director who suggested the location was better, and further stated there would be a further community discussion concerning this matter, but Mr. Rodriguez was unsure whether such a community discussion ever took place. Mr. Rodriguez further stated he would like to continue and finalize the permitting process; that it is always easier to revise the permit and move back the building, but in the meantime, he will look into cost for the redesign which is just basically the site plan with some modifications to the utility, and before construction is started, he will approach the community and the board to ensure that some type of compromise is reached; that if it becomes necessary, he can go back and amend the contract, amend the redesign.

Board Member Powers reminded the board that this conversation was taken up about five years ago or longer about the fact that the acre to one side would remain undisturbed, and that if they were going to have to move anything, they would move the playground to put in more tennis courts; that they would never touch the other half of the property that has nothing on it. He further stated he has in his possession 500 signatures of the people who directly surround the park, saying that that is precisely what they wanted to occur and the fact that they did not need a 2,000 square foot space as far as a community center.

Vice Chair Broton inquired as to whether Mr. Rodriguez would be revisiting with the community to ensure that the way the project is moving forward is what the community wants. Mr. Rodriguez replied that the site plan will be distributed through the community and from what he understands and from comments presently made, the board concurs with the current site plan.

Board Member Lambert commented that the last time this issue was discussed in detail, the present site plan looks like it is in accord with what was discussed, but the rendering looked "iffy," and that is why Board Member Lambert asked for some clarification this evening; that as long as the project of moving forward according to the present site plan, he feels that his concerns plenty of the people that surround the neighborhood's concerns "will be okay." He further stated that there are many members of the community still debate whether or not they needed a building so large, but the placement of the building has been at different times on different locations on the site plan; however, what was presented this evening as the current site plan, he is in agreement with the current site plan.

4. Hadley Park New Youth Center – Design Services--Presentation by Jeovanny Rodriguez. This project is 100 percent designed and permitted. The project has been advertised for construction. It's recently been funded. Scope of project is a 23,000 square-foot gymnasium. The building would include indoor basketball court, exercise room, adjacent lockers and restrooms, classrooms, meeting rooms, computer rooms, office space and storage, building lobby reception area and will interconnect with new covered drop-off area that will abut the cultural plaza. Estimated construction cost: \$6,535,777, out of which \$1,591,297 is HD funds. Negotiations are currently taking place with the low bidder to try to finalize the contract. The

reason for the present negotiations with the low bidder is because it has been so long since advertising took place -- more than 120 days since the bids were due and low bidder needs to accept the low price before moving forward. The project is expected to begin construction relatively soon.

Board Member Goa expressed his concern about whether the project would include a circular driveway done at the senior building, not just a covered drop-off area. Board Member Goa specifically requested that the plans clearly indicate a circular driveway; not just a covered drop-off area.

Mr. Rodriguez assured Board Member Goa that the current site plan does include a circular driveway as well as a covered drop-off area.

Board Member Aluko that the CIP Department provide the board members with the most recent site plan and floor plans for this project; that the board needs a complete master plan. Board Member inquired as to what the amount of the lowest bidder of this project was.

Mr. Rodriguez stated that the amount of the lowest bidder was \$5,961,616 but that's not the final number for the project because it does not include all of the bid alternatives.

Board Member Aluko requested that the final negotiated price be provided to the board once that price is determined.

Chair Solares reminded the board that this project has already been approved by the City Commission.

#### V. ADDITIONAL ITEMS:

- ➤ 2013 Annual Report: The annual report is scheduled to come before the Commission in March 2014, to be presented by Chair Solares. Board Member Powers offered to attend the March 2014 City Commission with Chair Solares.
- ➤ Remediation in Some of the City's Parks: Mr. Rodriguez informed the board that he would be coming back on the next meeting or relatively soon with several requests to utilize some of the HD funds available to continue with some of the park contamination and the actual remediation that will have to be engaged in some of the City's parks. Mr. Rodriguez further stated that he consulted with the City Attorney's Office to ensure that type of use is consistent with the funds, and he was told that it is.

Bond counsel confirmed that he approved the use of the funding for remediation in the City's parks. Bond counsel stated, "We've looked into it, and that is an acceptable use for the funds."

Mr. Rodriguez stated he is in the process now of trying to finalize some of those cost estimates for some of the affected parks and he hopes to have all the information

ready, hopefully for the next meeting so he can present it to the board for review and approval.

> Seawall for Manatee Park. Board Member Powers requested an update on the status of the seawall for Manatee Park including what monies will come from the HD fund regarding this project. Mr. Rodriguez indicated this project was recently approved for phase two, which is the construction phase; that he is still in the process of finalizing the permits for this project.

#### VI. CHAIRMAN OPEN AGENDA:

Vice Chair Broton requested a financial report be provided to the board which should include the status of all projects and available funding.

The meeting adjourned at 6:50 p.m.

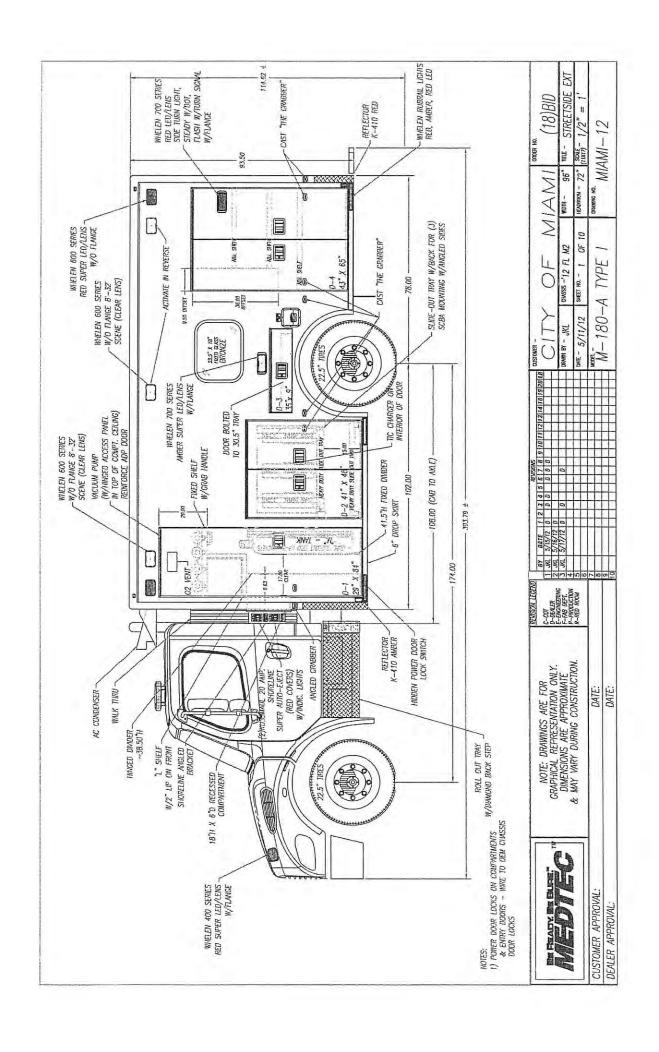

Larry Spring (Chief Financial Officer): Are there any other questions? I'd like to answer them all at the same time.

Charisse Grant: Does GSA have a regular schedule of maintenance for all of those properties?

Mr. Spring: Rolando, to answer your 50,000-foot question, the person or persons who are responsible for taking that high-level look and saying, okay, we've just invested \$155 million dollars, are we also ensuring in the operational budgets of each of the departments who are then responsible for maintaining those properties, that is something that's taken care of in our overall budget process. During that process, that information is provided by the directors to the Budget director in great detail. That information is then funneled up to myself, Roger Hernstadt, the other assistant city manager over budget, our City Manager, our Mayor and all our Commissioners. In individual meetings, we discuss all of those issues. They do come to the forefront, and then what is presented to our overall Commission includes those issues. We're moving staff around to be present. We're outreaching to different third parties to even help us program the facilities.

Vice Chairman Aedo: Is there, in the capital improvement world or in the budgeting world, a general rule of thumb when you're making a capital investment that "X" needs to be added into an upcoming budget cycle to account for the proper maintenance of that asset?

Mr. Spring: There are plenty of operational standards, if you will, that exist. Part of the requirements of the capital plan is that when we have a project coming up, the user department is supposed to submit a five-year or ten-year operating plan. So you'll have the capital piece and then you'll have this multiyear budget that shows some of the operational needs. Clearly, we're not going to allow for maintenance to suffer again. We're not going to go back through this cycle that we just found ourselves getting out of. However, we do have to balance all of our budgetary constraints. A lot of the maintenance is on-call. We have been in the mode of trying to develop a routine maintenance program in GSA, but we're going from zero to a hundred in a matter of a few years.

## 2. Additional Funding for MiaMarina Emergency Repair Pier #5

Eileen Broton reported that the project is another revenue generator for the City. They're requesting \$97,000 of the original approved amount. The project will replace damaged pre-cast concrete stringers, replacement of wood decks with fiberglass and replacing utility services. The contract has already been awarded and construction is anticipated to begin next month with a targeted completion date in late September of '09.

- 3. Pierce Lance HAZMAT Vehicle for the Fire Department AND
- 4. Defense and Security Equipment Acquisition

Eileen Broton reported that the item was purchased and put into service in May 2008, and the Board requested information on how often it is used. Item 4, Defense and Security Equipment Acquisition, includes the scuba gear, which will be ordered in May of 2009, and also the training center. The standards for the training center are constantly changing, and the Fire Department is looking for the proper site and trying to see the latest requirements, so this may be on hold until possibly the last quarter of 2009, and we has asked the Fire Department to provide more information for us.

Joe Fernandez, assistant fire chief with the Department of Fire-Rescue, reported that he replaced Chief Duran on the project. The Pierce Lance truck was put in service in May 2008. It was purchased at budget, \$564,577. I do not have an exact number of alarm numbers to date, but I will tell you that this truck does not go out on every single call, kind of like you see the first line pumpers and aerial and rescue trucks. It's a specialized piece of equipment and it goes on certain types of calls when the dispatches come in, whether there's chemical situations, even structural events, and a variety of other specialized scenarios that we might have to respond to. As you know, the previous vehicle was beyond its service life, and the truck really has been a great asset, especially in the midst of everything that we find ourselves under these days, having a vehicle to move around the necessary equipment is very important. So we appreciate your support on it. And if you would like the number of calls that it has responded to since May 29, I can send that to the staff, and they can give it to you via e-mail. Regarding the scuba gear, the equipment here will allow for ten full sets of scuba gear, plus backup equipment to make sure we always have ten sets at the ready to do the services that we aim to do with this equipment. It will be, again, a citywide asset that will be located on the marine unit, and it's of great value, as I said, both for the citizens or visitors that may require services of this type, and for the firefighters themselves, to have the best gear possible to do the job they need to do. I did make a typo here. It was not the staff's fault. If you add the two items, it should come to 899. You see this says 32 as the estimated cost and it's actually 34. So if you add the 34 to the other total, you do get to the 899, but that was my error. This is currently slightly delayed due to a bid issue that the Purchasing Department wanted to do a split bid, I believe. I'm still transitioning with Chief Duran, but it's slightly delayed because of a process in the Purchasing Department, but we do expect to issue a purchase order by March '09 and delivery should be immediately after. This is all equipment, materials that are all readily available. Regarding the training tower, I gave you a sampling here of some photos from the various vendors that might be the actual suppliers of this equipment, and this type of training is not only very valuable, but subsequent to a state rule, the training tower is now a requirement with specific standards for a certificated training facility. This is a new standard. We do not meet the standard, so this is required to remain as a certified training facility within the state. And these are two samples of more or less, what you would see the end product looking like, and then one of the props or simulation aids you'll see to the right is supposed to be a vehicle. It has the overall shape of a vehicle, but it is fed by gas. It's basically an appliance, and it allows the firefighters to practice with car fires and there's a few other simulation aids also so that they can train, and that's also required by that Rule 4837 that was imposed a year and a half or two years ago. Currently, this is proposed to be used at our training facility in Coconut Grove, where we do most of our other training. And there's an estimated 25 percent completion on the design phase. We're estimating somewhere around June 2010 to be complete on this project.

## 5. Armbrister Park Boundless Playground

Ed Blanco, Parks Department, reported that the project was completed. It was a \$250,000 project, and in addition to that, which you don't see in the pictures, we also added some swings on the other side of the play ground, at an additional \$50,000, swings with a rubber surface. So this whole project is about a \$300,000 project.

## 6. Athalie Range Park - Mini Stadium Complex

Eileen Broton reported that the project has been designed and is ready to go out for bid. The project is in the permitting stages. The Parks Department will make arrangements for the activities when the park must be closed for the construction.

Ed Blanco, Parks Department, reported that the permitting has been completed. The project is currently being bid out. The bid award date has been set for February 9, with an estimated construction to begin late March or early April.

## 7. Williams Park Recreation Building Improvements

Eileen Broton reported that this is not an improvement. It's going to be a new building, and there was a charrette held January 22 and it was highly announced to the public.

Ola Aluko, director, CIP, reported that there was a charrette last Thursday and the public received the plans very well, and we were given a vote of confidence to move forward. As of today, I believe we gave the architect an NTP to submit his proposal, and hopefully, within the next couple of days, we'll get a proposal for the design, and we'd like to move forward with the construction. This is another case where the original project was planned to be a renovation. We were going to add spaces to the park. The community made some comments to staff, to the administration and we listened to the community and we realized that with today's prices that we're getting in the construction industry, we can actually build a new building at the same cost that we were originally going to renovate and add spaces to the building. So we're actually doubling the size. The existing

Ola Aluko, CIP Director, stated that the land acquisition was already approved by the City Commission and the item was placed on the agenda as an informational item. The City acquired 1814 Brickell Avenue for parks improvements. Right now the project is strictly an acquisition. However, some funds may be being identified for the development of the park. There were some homeland defense interest dollars used.

#### V. PROJECT UPDATES:

1. Defense and Security Equipment Acquisition

Assistant Fire Chief Valdora Arthur, Fire-Rescue, reported that there are two components of the defense and security acquisition project, one of which is the scuba gear. The scuba gear for the dive team was acquired in September 2009 and has been put in service for use by the dive team for a variety of water emergencies, such as drowning accidents, watercraft accidents, body recovery, and for training as well. The gear has significantly enhanced operational and training capabilities. The projected cost was \$34,000. The actual total cost was \$22,216, which was a savings of \$11,784. The other component of the defense and security acquisition project is the fire training burn tower and search facility. The burn tower building safely prepares firefighters to meet the challenges of live fires in a structure to accommodate a variety of different conceivable fire-training scenarios, such as residential, commercial, high-rise, shipboard fires, et cetera. Besides being essential for the training of the firefighters, subsequent to State rules, the training tower building is now a requirement with specific standards for training facilities in the state of Florida. In addition to the requirement of having a training tower, the State also is considering rule changes that have significantly affected the specifications for this training tower. Thus, it has prohibited the department from moving forward because the changes have not been adopted as of yet. Without knowing what these changes are, the department will hold off until the changes are actually adopted.

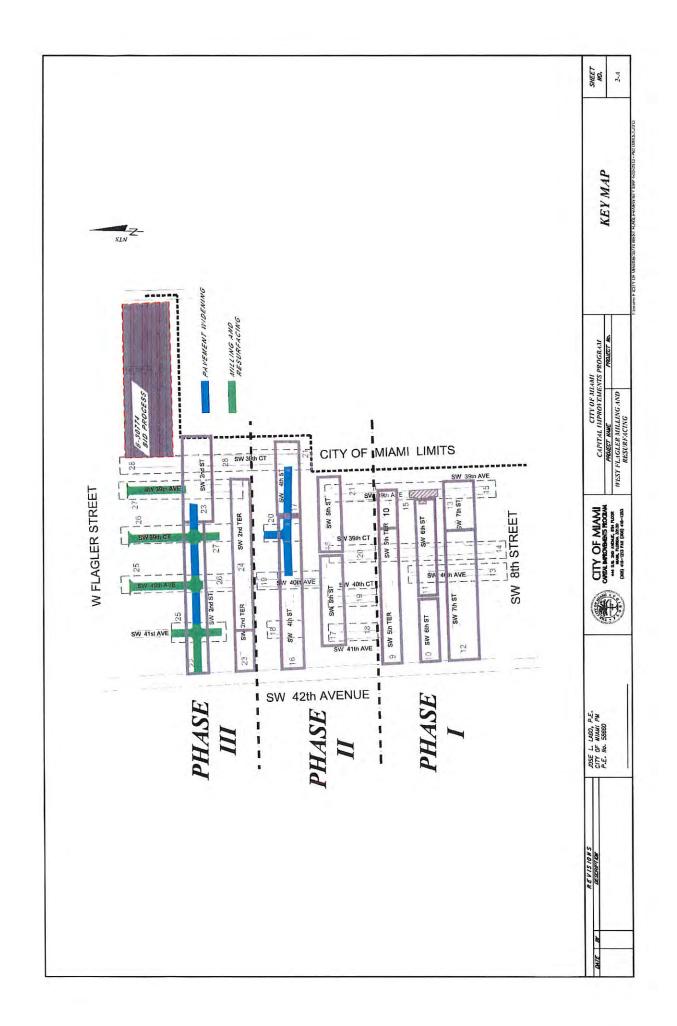

Dear Ms. Bravo:

Based on the findings from two City of Miami Parks, Blanche and Merrie Christmas, DERM recommends that an environmental status review of City of Miami Parks be conducted.

At a minimum, the following screening criteria should be used to evaluate the Parks. Historical land use using available records shall be evaluated, with particular emphasis on past uses such as rock quarries. Historical aerial photographs shall also be reviewed to assist in the evaluation or identify historical uses of the park, including landfilling activities. Additionally, the year of acquisition shall be used as screening criteria and whether a Phase 1/Phase 2 Environmental Audit was conducted at the property. These criteria will assist in the determination of whether site specific screening is warranted. The City may remove those parks from the screening process that have already undergone assessment and have already been addressed or are in the process of being addressed (e.g., Fern Isle, etc.). To assist in the screening process, DERM recommends that initial site screening begin with site reconnaissance to visually identify solid waste. Following site reconnaissance, a proposal for site specific soil sampling shall be prepared. The number and location of soil samples shall be based on the size of the park and location and size of open space areas within the park. Based upon the results, the appropriate recommendation to address parks identified with contamination shall be made.

Dear Mr. Casey:

We reviewed the documentation provided for Southside Park located at 100 SW 11<sup>th</sup> Street in Miami to determine if the site was eligible for USF funding and inclusion in the County's Comprehensive Landfill Closure Plan. Any waste site located in Miami-Dade County may be considered eligible for USF funding from the Public Works and Waste Management Department (PWWM) if it meets the following criteria, subject to a determination by the PWWM Bond Engineer:

- The site must be owned by a municipal government (includes County-owned sites)
- There must be documented ground water contamination at the site that exceeds RER standards and poses a potential risk of water supply contamination as determined by RER, and/or
- 3. There must be documented evidence that the site was used as a landfill

The documentation indicated that the site is owned by a municipality (the City of Miami), and subsurface soils sampling results indicated elevated concentrations of arsenic, barium, copper, and lead at several locations on site.

The Preliminary Site Assessment Report prepared by T.Y. LIN International/HJ Ross (TYLIN) dated January 30, 2014 included results from 32 soil borings and eight composite soil samples on the property, which indicated the presence of solid waste. The extent and depths below ground surface where the solid waste was found indicate landfilling activities were conducted at the site.

Dear Health Care Provider:

The Florida Department of Health (FDOH) is sending this letter because there have been media reports of heavy metals in City of Miami and Miami-Dade County public parks, such as Blanche Park, and families may have questions for their physicians. For up-to-date information, please see <a href="http://www.dadehealth.org/toxic.asp">http://www.dadehealth.org/toxic.asp</a>. The Poison Control Center is available 24 hours per day to provide information on testing and treating patients for heavy metals.

FDOH has so far determined that there is minimal health risk for children, adults, (and animals) who have had typical park/playground use over the last decade. For example, state toxicologists completed a Health Risk Assessment (HRA) for Blanche Park on November 25, 2013 that predicted that the levels of chemicals found in the park (soil and groundwater) were not likely to pose a health concern. The City of Miami is taking steps to prevent future exposure at Blanche and several other Miami parks. An HRA is only designed to determine if current levels of chemicals at that location would add additional risk to the public's background exposure to chemicals in their lives. The Health Risk Assessment cannot be used to link individual illnesses to past chemical exposures.

Clinicians and families may still have concerns about individuals with specific questions about clinical aspects of toxic exposures, such as possible symptoms, testing, and treatment. One option is to consult the Poison Control Center 24 hours/day by calling 1-800-222-1212. They can provide accurate information on the appropriate method for testing of heavy metals in blood and/or urine.

### HEAVY METAL POISONING

According to Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, there are many heavy metals in our environment both naturally and from pollution. Some of these, including copper, iron and zinc, play important roles in our bodies if they are in a normal level. Others have no known benefit for health.

There is growing evidence that "chronic" or long-term exposure to lower levels of heavy metals also causes health problems. The symptoms of chronic heavy metal poisoning can be severe, but are often less obvious and develop much more slowly over time than the symptoms caused by acute exposure.

- Many of the symptoms of heavy metal toxicity can include:
  - Alcohol intolerance, allergies (environmental and food sensitivities), chronic unexplained pain, coated tongue, cold hands and feet, dark circles under the eyes.
  - Extreme fatigue, depression, headaches, loss of memory and forgetfulness, low body temperature, metallic taste in the mouth, muscle and joint pain, muscle tics or twitches.
  - Muscle tremors, night sweats prone to rashes, prone to mood swings, sensitive teeth skin problems, sore or receding gums, tingling in the extremities, , unsteady gait, vitamins and mineral deficiencies.

True chronic heavy metal poisoning is rare. More often, these same symptoms can be caused by other health problems not related to a metal exposure at all.

Different heavy metals are best tested for in different ways. Some are tested for in urine, and some are tested for in blood samples. One single test is not going to give the best information for all heavy metals.

Diagnosis or treatment should not be based on hair analysis alone because hair may pick up materials such as sweat and dust that can contain many things, including heavy metals. A positive hair test cannot tell you how much of the metal is in your body or whether or not it is causing disease.

Clinicians and families with specific questions about clinical aspects of toxic exposures (possible symptoms, testing and treatment) should consult the Poison Control Center 24hrs/day by calling 800-222-1212.

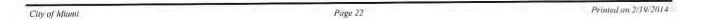
