III. <u>UPDATES</u>:

1. Marine Stadium Marina Improvements

Stephen Bogner, Public Facilities, reported that the project is waiting for the conclusion of the Virginia Key Master Plan in order to move forward with the construction of the new dry storage racks. The new marine item on today's agenda is closely related to this because it is requesting reallocation of \$150,000 of funding that's currently in place for the storage rack restoration to replace a covered rack roof at Marine Stadium Marina. Generally, the project is ready to move forward with design permitting and construction for the dry storage rack roofs. The project will add 87 additional storage racks to the dry storage marina.

2. Saunder's Plot Repairs at City Cemetery

Ed Blanco, Parks & Recreation, reported that the project is complete. The project was initiated almost two years and should have taken six months to complete, but because of severe problems with the contractor, the project too far longer than that. The project was completed March 2009 and came in under budget.

3. Paul S. Walker Park

Ola Aluko, Director, CIP, reported that this project is one of the City's most successful public-public partnerships. The City entered into an agreement with the Miami DDA to fund this project. Roughly 12 or less month's ago, the Department became before the Board and requested \$150,000 of the District 2 quality of life funds to go towards the construction of this park. The before picture of this project was a converted restaurant. The renovation was to convert it back to a park. The DDA put forth the balance of the funds, \$250,000, and the pocket park was created. The project was designed in-house. The landscape architecture was designed by the City Planning Department. The electrical was designed by a CIP engineer, and the DDA designed the civil aspects of the project. The project came in under budget.

4. Roberto Clemente Park New Recreation Building

Orlando Diez, CIP Department, reported that the project is under construction. The contractors and subcontractors have been selected. This week they have been doing infrastructure location, underground utilities, and things like that. The project includes a new one-story building, new landscaping, and new drainage. It appears that the project may come in under budget once it is completed.

5. Kinloch Storm Sewer Improvements - Design Services

Keith Ng, CIP Department, reported that the project is currently in the design phase and the design is 80 percent complete. The design components consist of road and drainage improvements. From the drainage improvement standpoint, the designer for the project has come with the proposal to install underground pipes, increase the number of catch basins, as well as increasing swale trenches, as well as rock trenches. This is in an effort to promote and increase drainage in the area. Right now the design of the drainage improvements is going to be centered heavily with more emphasis in areas where they're mostly hard hit in terms of flooding complaints and flooding situations. In addition to the drainage improvements are in place. Components of the road improvements include construction of regrading and resodding the swales, milling and resurfacing, replacing damaged sidewalks, replacing curb and gutters, and also increased tree plantings. The consultant has also agreed to look back in their design criteria to also

include additional tree planting in areas also where there are no drainage improvements. Essentially, what they have decided to do is try to add as many trees as possible within the project limits itself.

6. Robert King High Park Soccer Field

Fernando Paiva, CIP Department, reported that there are two ongoing projects at Robert King High Park. The projects will be bid concurrently. There was a little issue that had to be resolved with the engineers, so the plans will probably be received by the middle of this week. The projects are ready to be bid out. Within two to three months, the projects should be ready to break ground.

8. Hadley Park Youth Center and Field Improvements

Fernando Paiva, CIP Department, reported that proposals are being reviewed from the architects to complete a design criteria package. There will be a work order issued soon to start the design criteria package. The project will be a design-build project. The scope of the project includes a 22,000-square-foot facility, modifications to the parking lot and ball fields.

9. Additional Funding for Lummus Park Recreation Building

Carlos Vasquez, CIP Department, reported that the additional funding for Lummus Park was approved before. The park is complete. Substantial completion was achieved May 15. The project is now in close-out documentation process.

10. Additional Funding for Dorsey Park Building Renovation Expansion

Carlos Vasquez, CIP Department, reported that the project was completed on May 15 and is in the CO process.

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Subject: <u>Museum Park Project - Environmental Remediation Agreement with the Miami Art Museum</u> of Dade County Association, Inc. ("MAM") and the Museum of Science, Inc. ("MSM")

Background Information:

On September 12, 2008, the City of Miami ("City"), the Miami Art Museum of Dade County Association, Inc. ("MAM") and the Museum of Science, Inc. ("MSM"), together with Miami-Dade County, the Historical Association of Southern Florida, inc. and the Miami Sports and Exhibition Authority, executed a Memorandum of Understanding (the "MOU") setting forth the parties' intent to develop the Museum Park Project in Bicentennial Park (the "Project") as contemplated in the Master Plan for the Museum Park Project developed by Cooper Robertson and approved by the City Commission pursuant to Resolution No. 08-0126, adopted March 13, 2008. Pursuant to the MOU, on December 11, 2008 the City Commission adopted Resolution No. 08- 0707 approving the terms of and authorizing the City Manager to execute two (2) Lease Agreements respectively between the City of Miami ("City") and the Miami Art Museum of Dade County Association, Inc. (MAM) (the "MAM Lease") and between the City and the Museum of Science, Inc. (MSM) (the "MSM Lease"). These Leases each require the City to negotiate a tri-partite Development Agreement ("Development Agreement") and a tri-partite Environmental Remediation Agreement ("Remediation Agreement") with the museums for the consideration and approval of the City Commission. The execution of the Environmental Remediation Agreement is a condition precedent to the museums obtaining possession to their respective lease areas, without which the museums would be unable to commence construction.

Over the months subsequent to the approval of these leases, the City Administration and staff negotiated and developed terms to address the required environmental remediation that will allow the City and the museums to collaborate in the development of the approved environmental remediation plan to be submitted to DERM and allow the museums to quantify their respective financial obligations for the remediation costs in excess of \$2 million. In effect, the goal of this collaborative remediation effort is to provide a cost effective alternative to environmental remediation, if approved by the appropriate regulatory agency.

The City Administration is requesting that the City Commission approve and authorize the execution of this Environmental Remediation Agreement which is a condition to commencing construction funding.

A RESOLUTION OF THE MIAMI CITY COMMISSION, WITH ATTACHMENT(S), APPROVING THE TERMS OF, AND AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO EXECUTE, AN ENVIRONMENTAL REMEDIATION AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF MIAMI ("CITY"), THE MIAMI ART MUSEUM OF DADE COUNTY ASSOCIATION, INC. ("MAM") AND THE MUSEUM OF SCIENCE, INC.("MSM"), IN SUBSTANTIALLY THE FORM ATTACHED HERETO AS "EXHIBIT A", TO PROVIDE FOR THE PERFORMANCE OF ENVIRONMENTAL SITE ASSESSMENTS AND CORRESPONDING SITE REHABILITATION OF BICENTENNIAL PARK ("MUSEUM PARK"), INCLUDING SPECIFICALLY THE CITY'S OBLIGATION TO PAY UP TO \$2 MILLION DOLLARS TOWARD THE COST OF ENVIRONMENTAL REMEDIATION OF THE MAM AND MSM SITES, WITHIN MUSEUM PARK, WHICH HAVE BEEN LEASED TO MAM AND MSM FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE MUSEUM COMPONENT OF THE MUSEUM PARK PROJECT.

WHEREAS, on September 12, 2008, the City of Miami ("City"), the Miami Art Museum of Dade County Association, Inc. ("MAM") and the Museum of Science, Inc. ("MSM"), together with Miami-Dade County, the Historical Association of Southern Florida, Inc. and the Miami Sports and Exhibition Authority, executed a Memorandum of Understanding (the "MOU") setting forth the parties' intent to develop the Museum Park Project in Bicentennial Park (the "Project) as contemplated in the Master Plan approved by the City Commission pursuant to Resolution No. 08-0126, adopted March 13, 2008; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the MOU, on December 11, 2008, the City Commission adopted Resolution No. 08-01452, approving the terms of, and authorizing the City Manager to execute a lease agreement between the City and the Miami Art Museum of Dade County Association, Inc. (MAM) (the "MAM Lease"), and a lease agreement between the City and the Museum of Science, Inc. (MSM) (the "MSM Lease), for the development and operation of the Museum Component of the Museum Park Project in Museum Park (collectively, the "Leases"); and

WHEREAS, the Leases provide that the execution of an Environmental Remediation Agreement is a condition precedent to the possession date under the Leases and failure to execute the Environmental Remediation Agreement within 1 year from the effective date of the Leases may result in the termination of the Leases; and

WHEREAS, the City, MAM and MSM have negotiated the attached Environmental Remediation Agreement which, consistent with the terms of the Leases and the MOU provide, among other things, the City's obligation to contribute up to \$2 million dollars toward the cost of environmental remediation of the MAM and MSM sites, and the right of the Museums to terminate the Leases by June 9, 2009, if the cost of remediation exceeds \$2 million dollars and the Museums elect to not fund the deficiency;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF MIAMI, FLORIDA:

Section 1. The recitals and findings contained in the Preamble to this Resolution are adopted by reference and incorporated as if fully set forth in this Section.

Section 2. The terms, and the execution by the City Manager, of the Environmental Remediation Agreement, in substantially the form attached hereto as "Exhibit A", are hereby approved and authorized. The City Manager is further authorized to execute such other documents as may be required pursuant to, or to implement the Environmental Remediation Agreement.{1}

Section 3. This Resolution shall become effective immediately upon its adoption and signature of the Mayor.{2}

{1} The herein authorization is further subject to compliance with all requirements that may be imposed by the City Attorney, including but not limited to those prescribed by applicable City Charter and Code provisions.

{2} If the Mayor does not sign this Resolution, it shall become effective at the end of ten calendar days from the date it was passed and adopted. If the Mayor vetoes this Resolution, it shall become effective immediately upon override of the veto by the City Commission.

ENVIRONMENTAL REMEDIATION AGREEMENT

THIS ENVIRONMENTAL REMEDIATION AGREEMENT (the "<u>Agreement</u>") is made as of this <u>day</u> of May, 2009, by and among (i) the Miami Art Museum of Dade County Association, Inc., a Florida not-for-profit corporation ("<u>MAM</u>"). (ii) Museum of Science. Inc., a Florida not-for-profit corporation ("<u>MSM</u>)"; MAM and MSM are collectively referred to herein as the "<u>Museums</u>"), and (iii) the City of Miami, a municipal corporation of the State of Florida (the "<u>City</u>").

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, Miami-Dade County, the City, the Miami Sports and Exhibition Authority, MAM, MSM, and the Historical Association of South Florida, Inc. have entered into the Memorandum of Understanding executed on September 12, 2008 Concerning the Development, Design, Construction and Operation of the Museum Park Project (the "MOU") on land located in the Greater Miami downtown area, known as both "Bicentennial Park" and "Museum Park"; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the MOU, on December 11, 2008, the City Commission adopted Resolution No. 08- 0707, approving the terms of, and authorizing the City Manager to execute a lease agreement between the City and MAM (as amended, modified, restated, extended and supplemented from time to time, the "MAM Lease"), and a lease agreement between the City and MSM (as amended, modified, restated, extended and supplemented from time to time, the "MSM Lease"), for the development and operation of the Museum Component of the Museum Park Project in Museum Park (collectively, the "Leases"); and

WHEREAS, the Leases provide that the execution of an Environmental Remediation Agreement is a condition precedent to the possession date under the Leases and failure to execute the Environmental Remediation Agreement within 1 year from the effective date of the Leases may result in the termination of the Leases; and

WHEREAS, the City, MAM and MSM have negotiated this Environmental Remediation Agreement which, consistent with the terms of the Leases and the MOU, provides for, among other things, (i) the City's obligation to contribute up to \$2 million toward the cost of environmental remediation of the property covered by the Leases, as amended (the "Subject Property"), and (ii) the right of the Museums to terminate the Leases by June 9, 2009, if the expected cost of remediation exceeds \$2 million and the Museums elect to not fund the deficiency, and

WHEREAS, sampling conducted by environmental consultants for the Museums has indicated the presence on the Subject Property of contaminants of concern in excess of established soil and ground water clean-up target levels as set forth in Chapter 62-777, Fla. Admin. Code (the "<u>Contamination</u>," as further defined below); and

WHEREAS, the City has agreed in the MOU to pay up to \$2 million towards the cost of remediation "necessary to provide a clean site necessary for the Museums to construct their facilities."

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements contained in this Agreement, and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the Museums and the City hereby agree as follows:

<u>Recitals</u>. The foregoing recitals are true and correct and are incorporated herein by reference. Capitalized terms used herein without definition shall have the meanings given to them in the Leases.

Definitions.

(a) "<u>Contamination</u>" shall mean the presence of pollutants and hazardous substances in the soil and ground water in excess of federal, state, or county applicable standards or cleanup target levels, including but not limited to Ground Water Cleanup Target Levels and Soil Cleanup Target Levels as set forth in Chapter 62-777, Fla. Admin. Code.

(b) "<u>Environmental Cost</u>" shall mean the actual cost to perform and complete the Environmental Remediation with respect to the Subject Property only. "Environmental Cost" shall not include any costs or fees incurred by legal counsel for the Museums or the City.

(c) <u>"Environmental Cap</u>" shall mean, for purposes of this Agreement only, the \$2 million limit on the portion of the Environmental Costs that the City is obligated to pay for Environmental Remediation pursuant to this Agreement or the Leases.

(d) "<u>Environmental Remediation</u>" shall include all actions necessary to provide a clean site necessary for the Museums to construct their facilities, including without limitation any additional work required to delineate the extent of any Contamination beyond the work performed for the Museums as part of their environmental due diligence. Environmental Remediation shall also include all work required to address any Contamination pursuant to Chapters 62-770, 780, or 785, Florida Administrative Code, or Chapter 24, Miami-Dade County Code, including, but not limited to, preparation of a Site Assessment Report and/or Remedial Action Plan (the "Plan"). Notwithstanding the foregoing, nothing in this definition shall obligate the City to incur expenses or pay costs in excess of the Environmental Cap.

(e) "<u>Governmental Authority</u>" shall mean any federal, state, county, or local governmental agency asserting jurisdiction over the Environmental Remediation.

(f) "<u>No Further Action</u>" shall mean a no further action determination as provided for and in conformance with Rule 62-780.680, Fla. Admin. Code, either without Conditions or with Conditions.

Due Diligence, Cost Estimate, and Election to Proceed

(a) The Museums have procured Phase I and Phase II Environmental Site Assessments prepared by EE&G Environmental Services, LLC ("EE&G") as part of the Museums' environmental due diligence, which were delivered to the City on April 9,

{M2814247;1} miami 823440 (2K) 2009. The Phase II Environmental Site Assessment contains EE&G's findings with respect to the current environmental condition of the Subject Property and recommended actions to perform the Environmental Remediation with respect to the Subject Property.

(b) On March 11, 2009, the Museums delivered to the City the cost estimate for the Environmental Remediation with respect to the Subject Property (the "<u>Cost</u> <u>Estimate</u>"). Because the Cost Estimate exceeds \$2 million, the Museums shall have a period of ninety (90) days from delivery of the Cost Estimate to the City to agree how to apportion payment of the Environmental Cost in excess of \$2,000,000 among themselves and to advise the City in writing pursuant to paragraph 14 herein that they intend to proceed with the Museum Park Project (the "Election to Proceed"). If the Museums do not reach an agreement allocating responsibility for the Environmental Cost in excess of \$2,000,000 among themselves and do not provide the Election to Proceed within said 90day period, then this Agreement shall be null and void and of no further force and effect.

(c) If the Museums provide the Election to Proceed, the Museums shall be deemed to covenant and represent that they will be financially responsible and hold the City harmless for any and all of the Environmental Cost in Excess of the Environmental Cap until the Environmental Remediation at the Subject Property is deemed complete pursuant to paragraph 5 of this Agreement herein. At the same time they provide the Election to Proceed, the Museums shall provide the City with written evidence that they have the financial ability to pay any and all Environmental Cost in excess of the Environmental Cap.

Environmental Remediation.

(a) By no later than July 1, 2009, the City shall engage an environmental consultant reasonably acceptable to the Museums (the "<u>Consultant</u>") to prepare a draft Plan that includes the Subject Property. The Museums and the City shall work jointly to support the Consultant's development of a Plan that is consistent with the intent of the MOU and reasonably acceptable to all Parties.

(b) The City shall have final decision-making authority with respect to approval of the Plan, consistent with Section 10 of this Agreement. Nothing in this Agreement shall divest or abrogate the City's right to final approval of the Plan which approval shall not be unreasonably withheld, in the event the Museums elect to proceed under Sections 4(c) or 9(b) of this Agreement. The City shall use its best efforts to prepare and submit the Plan to the Governmental Authorities by no later than September1, 2009. The City shall manage the Consultant's efforts to obtain all necessary approvals by Governmental Authorities, including approval of the Plan. With respect to the Subject Property, the City shall use its best efforts to obtain approval of the Plan by November 30, 2009. Once commenced, the City shall diligently proceed to perform the Plan to completion.

(c) At their sole discretion, the Museums may perform the work authorized by the Plan with respect to the Subject Property provided that they notify the City in writing pursuant to paragraph 14 herein of their intent to do so within fifteen (15) calendar days of the Museums' receipt of DERM's approval of the Plan. Otherwise, the City shall manage the Consultant's performance of the Environmental Remediation. If the Museums elect to perform the work authorized by the Plan with respect to the Subject Property, they shall engage and manage an environmental consultant reasonably acceptable to the City ("the Museums' Consultant.")

(d) The agreements with the Consultant and, if applicable, the Museums' Consultant (together, as may be the case, the "Parties' Consultants"), shall provide that the Environmental Remediation shall be conducted in a good and workman-like manner, consistent with good practices and standards of the environmental remediation industry in Miami-Dade County, Florida, and in accordance with Applicable Laws, and shall be initiated and completed as expeditiously as possible, consistent with the terms of this Agreement. The agreements shall also include indemnifications in favor of the City and the Museums and shall name the Museums and the City as additional insureds, providing scope and amounts of coverage mutually acceptable to the Museums and the City. Such policy shall remain in effect until the completion of the Environmental Remediation as defined in Section 5 of this Agreement. Prior to conducting any Environmental Remediation as defined in Surance, reasonably acceptable to the Museums and the City.

<u>Completion of the Environmental Remediation</u>. The Environmental Remediation with respect to the Subject Property shall be deemed to be completed at the earliest of any of the following:

(a) Any Governmental Authority with jurisdiction over the Environmental Remediation has issued one or more No Further Action(s) without Conditions that includes the entirety of the Subject Property; or

(b) Any Governmental Authority with jurisdiction over the Environmental Remediation has issued one or more No Further Action(s) with Conditions that includes the entirety of the Subject Property, which Conditions, in the reasonable judgment of the Museums, shall not adversely affect the construction of the Museums' Improvements (as defined in the Leases) as planned, including without limitation the cost of construction, or the use of the Subject Property for operation of the Museums in accordance with the Leases, and any conditions to the No Further Action have been completed to the Governmental Authority's satisfaction, except for conditions to the No Further Action which by their nature are continuous or ongoing for the entire duration of the No Further Action, such as a requirement to maintain an impervious cap.

1. <u>Compliance with No Further Action</u>. The City and the Museums, to the extent applicable, shall comply with any conditions of the No Further Action, except that for the Subject Property only, (a) once the Environmental Cap has been exceeded, any cost of compliance with affirmative obligations under the No Further Action(s) shall not be at the City's expense, and (b) neither the City nor the Museums shall modify the terms of the No Further Action(s) without the written consent of the other party.

2. <u>Site Access.</u> If the Museums do not elect to perform the Environmental Remediation of the Subject Property pursuant to this Agreement, the Museums shall provide the City and the City's Consultant unimpeded access to the Subject Property.

3. <u>Communications</u>.

(a) The City shall cause the Consultant to report to the Museums and the City simultaneously on the progress of the preparation, submittal. and approval of the Plan, and the progress and performance of the Environmental Remediation at least monthly (the "Monthly Environmental Remediation Status Report").

(b) For purposes of Section 8 only, the City and the Museums shall, within five (5) Business Days following the executive of this Agreement, identify in writing one technical representative each to act as their environmental representatives (the "Designated Environmental Representatives") to transmit and receive all notices required under Section 8. In the event that the Designated Environmental Representatives are unavailable (e.g., on vacation or leave), an alternative person should be designated to ensure that communications between the Museums and the City continue without interruption.

(c) The City's Designated Environmental Representatives shall provide or cause the Consultant to provide the Museums' Designated Environmental Representative with reasonable advance notice of any proposed meeting or telephone conference with Governmental Authorities concerning the Contamination or the Environmental Remediation so the Museums' representatives have the opportunity to attend and participate in such meeting or telephone conference.

(d) The City's Designated Environmental Representative shall provide or cause the Consultant to provide the Museums' Designated Environmental Representatives with copies of all correspondence with any Governmental Authorities concerning the Contamination, the Environmental Remediation, or approvals related to the Contamination or Environmental Remediation promptly upon receipt or transmittal. Said correspondence shall include but not be limited to any letters, email, electronic enclosures transmitted by email, reports, plans, documents, tables, graphs, photographs, or discs (herein after "Environmental Correspondence").

(e) Prior to submission to any Governmental Authority, the Museums' Designated Environmental Representative shall be provided with, for their review and comment, a draft of any Environmental Correspondence required to be submitted to any Governmental Authority for its approval and/or consent. Except as required by Environmental Law, the Museums' Designated Environmental Representative shall have five (5) Business Days to review any draft materials and transmit their comments to the City's Designated Environmental Representative. Neither the Consultant nor the City may finalize any draft materials until the earlier of either the lapse of the 5-day review period or the transmittal in writing of the Museums' comments, which comments the City shall consider and incorporate in their reasonable discretion.

(f) If, pursuant to this Agreement, the Museums elect to perform the Environmental Remediation of the Subject Property, the Museums shall have reciprocal obligations under this Section 8 to the City.

(g) Notwithstanding Section 8 subparagraphs (a) through (e) above, the Museums shall have the right to communicate directly with the Miami-Dade County Department of Environmental Resources Management ("DERM") on any matter related to the Environmental Remediation contemplated for the Subject Property until such time as they submit the Election to Proceed to the City (the "Preliminary DERM Communications"). Any Preliminary DERM Communications shall be made in cooperation with the City, including that the Museums will provide the City with final copies of all written materials submitted to DERM simultaneously with their submittal and shall provide the City with reasonable notice and opportunity to participate in any teleconference and meeting that the Museums schedule with DERM or that DERM schedules with the Museums.

(h) All expenses incurred by the Museums in connection with any Preliminary DERM Communications, including but not limited to attorneys' and consultant fees and costs, shall be borne solely by the Museums and shall not constitute or otherwise be deemed an Environmental Cost that the City is obligated to pay for Environmental Remediation pursuant to this Agreement or the Leases.

4. <u>Time is of the Essence</u>. The Parties shall be responsible for the diligent performance of their respective duties set forth herein.

(a) No party shall be deemed to have violated this provision of the Agreement if the cause for delays is an Unavoidable Delay or otherwise beyond the party's control, including without limitation delays occasioned by the acts or omissions of any Governmental Authority. Except as expressly set forth herein, time is of the essence in completion of the Environmental Remediation.

In the event (i) the City fails to engage the Consultant by July 1, 2009, (ii) (b) the Museums reasonably believe that the City will not submit the Plan to DERM by September 1, 2009, or, (iii) based on written comments from DERM to the Plan submitted by the City, the Museums reasonably believe that DERM will not approve the Plan by November 30, 2009, and, in the case of (i), the failure or, in the case of (ii) and (iii), the reasonably likely failure to meet any of these deadline is not caused by any lack of cooperation on the part of the Museums, the Museums may, within five (5) Business Days of the applicable deadline and provided that written notice is given to the City pursuant to paragraph Section 14 herein, elect at that time to perform the Environmental Remediation with respect to the Subject Property (the "Early Remediation Assumption Notice"). Other than the costs associated with the finalization or modification of the Plan by the Museums that would be duplicative of those costs already incurred by the City in preparation of the Plan, the City shall pay for the Environmental Cost as set forth in subparagraphs (b), (c), and (d) of Section 12 of this Agreement from the date of the Early Remediation Assumption Notice, as may be applicable. By way of clarification, under no circumstances shall the amount paid by the City toward the Environmental Cost exceed the Environmental Cap, and the City's obligation, if any, to reimburse the Museums is governed accordingly.

5. <u>Cooperation</u>.

Except as specifically set forth in this Agreement or in the event that the Museums elect to perform the Environmental Remediation with respect to the Subject Property, and as otherwise required by law, the Museums covenant and agree that to the extent that it has comments on the Environmental Remediation, it shall make such comments directly to the City and will not independently contact or meet with the Governmental Authority regarding the Environmental Remediation. The City shall, reasonably and in good faith, consider all comments offered by the Museums. The City and the Museums covenant and agree that they will use their respective good faith efforts to cooperate in connection with the timely and cost-effective performance of the Environmental Remediation, for both the Museum Park Parcel and the Subject Property, including without limitation, development and implementation of a cost-effective Plan for the Museum Park Parcel and, consistent with Sections 2(d) and 5 of this Agreement, the Subject Property (and any modification thereto that may become required by law or this Agreement or otherwise necessary), and the consideration of cost-effective remediation solutions such as raising the elevation of the Museums' facilities or the reuse of soil within Museum Park, and furtherance of the objectives of this Agreement.

6. Brownfield Designation and Rehabilitation.

(a) Nothing herein shall preclude the City from electing to designate the Subject Property as a Brownfield Area and entering into a Brownfield Site Rehabilitation Agreement ("BSRA"), as those terms are defined in and processes provided by the Brownfields Redevelopment Act, §§ 376.77 - 376.85, Florida Statutes, and seeking one or more Voluntary Cleanup Tax Credit ("VCTC") certificates pursuant to Chapter 62-788, Fla. Admin. Code unless such actions conflict with this Agreement or any other agreements between the City and Museums. In no event shall the City's efforts to designate the Subject Property as a Brownfield Area be a reason or excuse for delay in the performance and completion of the Environmental Remediation or cause a delay in the commencement of construction.

(b) If the City so elects, the Museums agree to cooperate in the efforts to designate the Subject Property as a Brownfield Area, enter into a BSRA, and obtain one or more VCTC certificates, except that the Museums shall not be required to expend funds to do so or delay performance of the Environmental Remediation for same.

(c) All provisions of this Agreement relating to the City's obligations with respect to the Environmental Remediation apply to any actions the City may take under a BSRA relating to the Subject Property during the terms of the Leases. The terms of a BSRA with respect to the Subject Property shall not lessen or alter the City's obligations to perform the Environmental Remediation with respect to the Subject Property under this Agreement. To the extent that the terms of a BSRA relating to the Subject Property conflict with the terms of this Agreement, the terms of this Agreement shall govern.

(d) Costs incurred in connection with the City's efforts to seek designation of the Subject Property as a Brownfield Area shall not be considered part of the Environmental Cost.

7. <u>Payment of the Environmental Cost</u>.

(a) The Consultant shall provide estimates as needed for its work on the Environmental Remediation with respect to the Subject Property to the City and the Museums. The City and the Museums shall review the estimates and note any objections to the estimates in writing within ten (10) days of receipt. Failure to object within the time allotted shall constitute approval of the estimates.

The Consultant shall from time to time, but no more frequently than (b) monthly, submit a detailed invoice or reimbursement request to the City and the Museums for the Environmental Cost authorized by this Agreement, along with reasonable substantiating documentation as requested by the City and/or the Museums and such other evidence as the City and/or the Museums may request to document verified compliance with the terms of the Consultant's agreement (by way of example, compliance with the insurance requirements) (collectively, a "Disbursement Request"). Unless the City or the Museums object to the Disbursement Request within ten (10) Business Days of receipt, the Disbursement Request shall be deemed approved and the City shall pay same in accordance with the Consultant's agreement no later than thirty (30) days within receipt of all properly documented invoices. Neither the City nor any Museum shall be permitted to object to a Disbursement Request unless it reasonably believes that the invoices and/or supporting documentation included in the Disbursement Request does not evidence a proper disbursement or a proper allocation to the Subject Property under this Agreement. If any Party gives timely written notice of its objections, (i) the City shall pay the portion (if any) of the Disbursement Request to which there was no objection, and (ii) the Consultant, City and Museums shall use commercially reasonable and good faith efforts to resolve the objections regarding the disputed portion of the Disbursement.

(c) If the Museums elect to perform the Environmental Remediation of the Subject Property, the Museums shall be entitled to reimbursement from the City of each Disbursement Request paid by the Museums hereunder, subject to the terms hereof, including the provisions of Section 12(b) above. The City shall make payment within thirty (30) days after the date the City receives a "reimbursement request" from the Museums, which shall consist of a copy of the Disbursement Request for which the Museums seek reimbursement and evidence of the Museums' payment of same (such as cancelled checks or paid invoices).

(d) The Museums shall be entitled to reimbursement from the City for the actual costs invoiced by EE&G and paid for by the Museums (the "EE&G Costs") for the combined Phase I and Phase II Environmental Site Assessments dated April 6, 2009. In consideration for reimbursing EE&G Costs to the Museums, the Museums shall authorize EE&G to issue a Right of Reliance Letter in favor of the City, which letter shall expressly state that the City may use any and all data from the EE&G Reports as may be necessary in connection with Site Rehabilitation at Museum Park (the "EE&G Right of Reliance Letter"). The City shall make reimbursement to the Museums consistent with this paragraph no later than thirty (30) days after receipt of the EE&G Right of Reliance

Letter. All monies paid to the Museums pursuant to this paragraph shall be included in the definition of Environmental Costs and subject to the Environmental Cap.

(e) If at any time it appears that the Environmental Cost associated with Remediation at the Subject Property will exceed the Environmental Cap, the City shall only be required to, as may be applicable, pay or reimburse the Museums for any invoice by the ratio of the Environmental Cap to the Environmental Cost, with the numerator being the Environmental Cap and the denominator being the Environmental Cost. By way of example, if the total anticipated Environmental Cost is \$5 million, then the City shall be required to pay two-fifths of every disbursement request up to the Environmental Cap. Under no circumstances shall the amount paid by the City toward the Environmental Cost exceed the Environmental Cap, and the City's obligation, if any, to reimburse the Museums is governed accordingly.

8. <u>Indemnification and Allocation of Liability.</u> Article VIII of each of the Leases contains certain provisions regarding indemnification and allocation of responsibility for Hazardous Materials and other environmental conditions before and after the Possession Date under the Leases. Such provisions are incorporated by reference into this Agreement. In the event of any conflict between the terms of this Agreement and Article VIII of the Leases, the provisions of Article VIII of the Leases shall govern.

9. <u>Notices</u>. All notices or other communications required or permitted to be given under this Agreement shall be given to the parties and become effective as provided in this Agreement as follows:

10. <u>Remedies</u>. In the event of a breach of this Agreement, then in addition to any specific rights and remedies provided for under the terms hereof, the non-breaching party shall have all remedies available in equity and at law for the redress of such default, including without limitation (i) an action for damages, (ii) an action for temporary and/or permanent injunction, (iii) an action for specific performance of the terms, conditions and obligations of this Agreement, and (iv) any combination of the foregoing. In the event any action is brought to enforce the terms, conditions and obligations of this Agreement, the prevailing party in any such action shall be entitled to the recovery of costs and disbursements of such action, as well as reasonable attorney's fees incurred in and about such action, at trial on all appellate levels. Any sums not paid when due by a breaching party shall bear interest at the maximum lawful rate from the date due until paid.

11. <u>Binding Effect</u>. This Agreement shall be binding on the parties hereto, their successors and assigns, and all other persons claiming by, through, or under them. This Agreement shall not be assigned by any party hereto without the consent of the other parties hereto.

12. <u>Interpretation</u>. The Parties to this Agreement have all participated equally in the negotiation and preparation of this document, and the same shall not be more strictly construed against any one of them.

13. <u>Duplicate Originals</u>. This Agreement may be executed in any number of duplicate originals and each duplicate original shall be deemed to be an original.

14. <u>Applicable Law</u>. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed according to the laws, from time to time in effect, of the State of Florida.

15. <u>Headings</u>. The article, section, and subsection entitlements of this Agreement are inserted for convenience of reference only and shall in no way alter, modify, or define, or be used in construing, the text of such articles, sections, or subsections.

16. <u>Amendment and Waiver</u>. This Agreement contains the entire agreement between the parties with respect to the Environmental Remediation. The provisions of this Agreement may be amended or waived only by an instrument in writing signed by both the Museums and the City. No waiver of any provision of this Agreement shall be effective unless it is in writing, signed by the party against whom it is asserted and any such written waiver shall only be applicable to the specific instance to which it related and shall not be deemed to be a continuing or future waiver.

18. <u>No Third Party Beneficiary</u>. Nothing expressed or implied herein is intended to or shall be construed to confer upon or give any person, firm or corporation other than the parties hereto any rights, remedies, obligations or liabilities under or by reason of this Agreement or result in their being deemed a third party beneficiary of this Agreement.

Gary Reshefsky requested that the CIP director talk to the members of the Board between now and the next meeting to clear up some questions and concerns brought up during the audit subcommittee meeting.

III. UPDATES:

1. Additional Grant to the Miami Art Museum to Support the Development of a Fine Art Museum Facility in Bicentennial Park

Terry Riley, director of the Miami Art Museum (MAM), reported that most significant to the overall project is the approval and execution this year of the memorandum of understanding, which outlines the duties and responsibilities of each of the parties, which are the City of Miami, Miami-Dade County, Miami Art Museum, Miami Science Museum, and the Historical Museum of South Florida. In September '06, MAM selected Herzog and de Meuron as its design architect. MAM unveiled the design concept for the new facility in December '07. Schematic design commenced in October '07. The schematic design drawings were completed and accepted by MAM in March '08. A set of the schematic design drawings were submitted to the City as part of MAM's reimbursement request. The next phase, the current phase, design development, commenced in April '08. This phase is now 50 percent complete and is on target for completion during the first quarter of calendar year '09. The MAM project includes approximately 200,000 square feet of both indoor and outdoor program spaces, as well as under-building parking, which will be contiguous with the parking for the Science Museum; for MAM, about 78,000 square feet. The total number of parking spaces between the two museums is estimated at 500. MAM submitted to the City a reimbursement request for the \$2 million allowed from the bond issue. The reimbursement was for architectural and engineering expenses, which actually totaled about \$2.9 million during the schematic design phase.

Carmen Matos asked at what stage will the County release additional funds. Mr. Riley stated that the MAM is trying to wrap up the lease negotiations with the City. MAM is very hopeful that the lease agreement will go to the City Commission in December.

Jose Solares asked who will manage the parking garage. Mr. Riley stated that the garage will have a single operator for both buildings and the garage will be a fee parking garage, open to the public.

Mariano Cruz asked what the timetable is for the project. Mr. Riley stated that MAM is very anxious to start the project and would like to break ground in April.

Gary Reshefsky asked how much money has been drawn from the Homeland Defense account for the project. Mr. Riley stated that the project withdrew the entire \$2.7 million that was allocated for the project.

Gary Reshefsky requested that MAM return in April to give the Board another update on the project.

2. Police Sky Watch Observation Tower

Major Armando Guzman reported that the tower has been purchased and the project is complete. The tower is able to extend up to 24 feet in height and provides an elevated platform by which to direct police resources in crow d situations and traffic situations.

3. Gusman Hall Improvements

Carmen Matos stated that the Gusman Hall improvements were completed last month. All of the doors are now ADA compliant. The refreshment stand, emergency lighting, and impact windows were all put in. The County and State provided matching funds for the project.

4. Dinner Key Mooring Anchorage Field Project

Carmen Matos stated that the project is estimated to be completed August 2009 and will increase capacity by 225 moorings and will increase revenue.

Thelma Free, assistant to the director of Public Facilities, reported that estimations for revenue increases were based on percentage of capacity. At 25 percent, \$159,750 is estimated; 50 percent, \$319,500; 75 percent, \$479,250; and 100 percent, \$639,000. The project is days away from the start of the bid process. The plans are about 99 percent complete. Public notice for bids is estimated for November, and approval from the Commission should be received by December so that construction can begin.

5. Preservation Development Initiative Grant

Carmen Matos stated that the grant was for technical assistance to write the transfer of development rights code for the City. The historic preservation officer has already written the code and money was recently used for a survey in the Upper Eastside to help the neighborhood of Palm Grove move forward with historic preservation designation. The designation is in process and the funds have been successfully used. The project grant is completed.

The firm of Cooper, Robertson & Partners has recently completed the schematic design phase, with an upcoming community presentation to occur at the end of April. The schematic design phase includes costs estimates and design studies for the overall park, the FEC slip, and in January, there was an increase to the contract to include the Parcel B property as part of the overall master plan. The original contract was for \$1,334,455. With the increase in January of \$65,545, the total project was allocated \$1,400,000. To date, with the completion of the schematic design phase, \$794,639.86 has been paid. With the presentations that will occur at the end of April with approvals of the work thus far, then Cooper, Robertson & Partners will proceed into design development.

10. Professional Services Agreement to Develop a Master Plan for the Parks Department

Ed Blanco, Parks & Recreation, reported that the parks master plan is well underway, over half of it is complete. There have been many public workshops held; one this past Saturday.

Lara De Souza, Parks & Recreation, reported that the plan began in August, and it started with visiting the 13 NET areas, holding workshops, which got feedback from the residents in terms of what they were looking for, what they were lacking, what they needed, what they like, and what they didn't like in their parks, and the second visit back to the neighborhood area was a presentation of vision boards that Goody Clancy took from what the neighborhood suggested and what they felt was actually feasible for that neighborhood. As they moved through the NET areas, they posted the vision boards on the parks master plan, which is www.miamiparksplan.com. Currently, all the vision boards are posted there, and there's also a feedback/comment page so that residents who are unable to attend those meetings could still give their ideas whether it was in relation to what was posted on the vision boards or something that they may have felt had not been gathered. The development of a science museum in Bicentennial Park has been the intent of the City since the late 1990's. The City allocated funding for the Miami Art Museum and the MSM projects from the the Homeland Defense Neighborhood Improvement Bond Program to be dispersed over several funding cycles. Combined, the museums were granted an initial \$2,800,000 of which \$700,000 was utilized by each museum to support development activities related to their project, including hiring consultants specializing in museum planning, financial feasibility and project management. The remaining \$1,400,000 was utilized by the City to hire.

The remaining \$1,400,000 was utilized by the City to hire Cooper, Robertson and Partners to prepare a master site plan and design development documents for the park. MSM has expended \$338,525 of their initial funding allocation and is requesting \$2,000,000 to further the Project. MSM anticipates spending the balance of their initial funding allocation, \$361,475 in the next few months on the following items: architectural fees for the first design phase (Grimshaw), project management (Oppenheim, Lewis), and survey and geotech work (TBD). The attached project cooperation agreement has been drafted to govern the responsibilities of the City and MSM in this endeavor. Funding will become available with the issuance of the next series of the Bonds; therefore the agreement will not be fully executed until that time.

Subject: Initial grant of \$700,000 to Miami Museum of Science for development of a science museum facility in Bicentennial Park

Purpose of Item:

To approve an initial grant of \$700,000 to the Miami Museum of Science ("MMOS") to support the development of a new science museum facility in the City-owned Bicentennial Park as authorized by a referendum of the voters in November 2001 as a specified project in the Homeland Defense Neighborhood Improvement Bond Program, authorizing the City Manager to execute the attached project cooperation agreement, and allocating funds from the Capital Improvement Project No. 333143 entitled "Museum of Science - Bicentennial Park".

Background Information:

The development of a science museum in Bicentennial Park has been the intent of the City since the late 1990's. When the voters approved the referendum for the Homeland Defense Neighborhood Improvement Bond Program in November 2001, this was an identified project in the public information campaign and enabling legislation. MMOS has now requested funds to support development activities related to the Project, including a community planning and education charrette and the work of consultants specializing in science museum planning, financial feasibility and project management, having an combined initial cost of \$1,400,000. The City will contribute \$700,000 as an initial grant from available Bond proceeds.

A project cooperation agreement has been devised to govern the responsibilities of the City and MMOS in this endeavor. Highlights of that agreement are:

* The museum project and related development activities are deemed to constitute a paramount public purpose

* The City will be given ownership of all documents, reports, materials and drawings that are developed with the assistance of City, and will be subsequently donated back to MMOS and the County, if applicable, for use on the Project

* MMOS and its successors will maintain public access to facilities developed with Bond proceeds, and said facilities will be publicly owned

26. Initial Grant to Miami Museum of Science for Development of a Science Museum Facility in Bicentennial Park

Gary Fabrikant, CIP Department, reported that there have been total reimbursements of \$228,627 on this project. Since the last update, there have been a drawdown of \$30,992. With the latest drawdown, the Museum of Science has commenced project planning. They are finalizing the drafting of the financial feasibility study. They have completed the capital feasibility study, and they have started their advertisement process for hiring a consultant for the project. Overall on the project completed to date, they have completed their planetarium feasibility study. They are finalizing their aquarium analysis, and they are finalizing the draft report on their cost analysis.

27. Increase in Compensation to HDR Inc. for Program Management Services for the Capital Improvements Plan Implementation

Gary Fabrikant, CIP Department, reported that a \$1.7 million increase was approved by the City Commission on March 10, 2005. The existing contract with HDR under this program has been completed. Currently, there is a balance showing of \$172,452. However, the Department is processing their final invoice, and once that invoice is approved, there will be approximately 6 to \$7,000 remaining balance on the contract.

6. Initial Grant to Miami Museum for Development of Fine Arts Museum Facility In Bicentennial Park

Gary Fabrikant, CIP Department, reported that the grant was originally in the amount of approximately \$700,000. The grant is for reimbursement of funds for planning development and project management activities related to the construction of the Miami Museum to be located at Bicentennial Park. To date, reimbursement has been made in the amount of \$457,805. The latest action taken on this project is that, on September 14, the design firm, Herzog & De Meuron, were hired for the new museum.

7. Initial Grant to Miami Museum of Science for Development of a Science Museum Facility in Bicentennial Park

Gary Fabrikant, CIP Department, reported that \$288,000 has been paid to date on this project. The Museum has requested to appear before the Board in October to request their next installment of funding to select their de sign firm.

Gary Reshefsky requested that the CIP director talk to the members of the Board between now and the next meeting to clear up some questions and concerns brought up during the audit subcommittee meeting.

III. UPDATES:

1. Additional Grant to the Miami Art Museum to Support the Development of a Fine Art Museum Facility in Bicentennial Park

Terry Riley, director of the Miami Art Museum (MAM), reported that most significant to the overall project is the approval and execution this year of the memorandum of understanding, which outlines the duties and responsibilities of each of the parties, which are the City of Miami, Miami-Dade County, Miami Art Museum, Miami Science Museum, and the Historical Museum of South Florida. In September '06, MAM selected Herzog and de Meuron as its design architect. MAM unveiled the design concept for the new facility in December '07. Schematic design commenced in October '07. The schematic design drawings were completed and accepted by MAM in March '08. A set of the schematic design drawings were submitted to the City as part of MAM's reimbursement request. The next phase, the current phase, design development, commenced in April '08. This phase is now 50 percent complete and is on target for completion during the first quarter of calendar year '09. The MAM project includes approximately 200,000 square feet of both indoor and outdoor program spaces, as well as under-building parking, which will be contiguous with the parking for the Science Museum; for MAM, about 78,000 square feet. The total number of parking spaces between the two museums is estimated at 500. MAM submitted to the City a reimbursement request for the \$2 million allowed from the bond issue. The reimbursement was for architectural and engineering expenses, which actually totaled about \$2.9 million during the schematic design phase.

Carmen Matos asked at what stage will the County release additional funds. Mr. Riley stated that the MAM is trying to wrap up the lease negotiations with the City. MAM is very hopeful that the lease agreement will go to the City Commission in December.

Jose Solares asked who will manage the parking garage. Mr. Riley stated that the garage will have a single operator for both buildings and the garage will be a fee parking garage, open to the public.

Mariano Cruz asked what the timetable is for the project. Mr. Riley stated that MAM is very anxious to start the project and would like to break ground in April.

Gary Reshefsky asked how much money has been drawn from the Homeland Defense account for the project. Mr. Riley stated that the project withdrew the entire \$2.7 million that was allocated for the project.

Gary Reshefsky requested that MAM return in April to give the Board another update on the project.

2. Police Sky Watch Observation Tower

Major Armando Guzman reported that the tower has been purchased and the project is complete. The tower is able to extend up to 24 feet in height and provides an elevated platform by which to direct police resources in crow d situations and traffic situations.

3. Gusman Hall Improvements

Carmen Matos stated that the Gusman Hall improvements were completed last month. All of the doors are now ADA compliant. The refreshment stand, emergency lighting, and impact windows were all put in. The County and State provided matching funds for the project.

4. Dinner Key Mooring Anchorage Field Project

Carmen Matos stated that the project is estimated to be completed August 2009 and will increase capacity by 225 moorings and will increase revenue.

Thelma Free, assistant to the director of Public Facilities, reported that estimations for revenue increases were based on percentage of capacity. At 25 percent, \$159,750 is estimated; 50 percent, \$319,500; 75 percent, \$479,250; and 100 percent, \$639,000. The project is days away from the start of the bid process. The plans are about 99 percent complete. Public notice for bids is estimated for November, and approval from the Commission should be received by December so that construction can begin.

5. Preservation Development Initiative Grant

Carmen Matos stated that the grant was for technical assistance to write the transfer of development rights code for the City. The historic preservation officer has already written the code and money was recently used for a survey in the Upper Eastside to help the neighborhood of Palm Grove move forward with historic preservation designation. The designation is in process and the funds have been successfully used. The project grant is completed.

After the ball fields are completed, next will be the water park and associated parking and landscaping, and the basketball court, and then the recreation community center. The entire park will be open in less than four years.

Fernando Paiva, CIP Department, reported that the design is 70 percent complete. The design completion is anticipated for July 2006. The estimated construction start date is after the summer program of 2006. The project's expected completion date is February 2007.

9. Coral Gate Park Building Improvements

Juan Ordonez, CIP Department, reported that the design process is complete, and the plans are in the process of permitting. There are pending issues with the Public Works Department and the Zoning Department. The constructed is estimated to begin when the second series bond monies are available.

Mary Conway, Director, CIP & Transportation, stated that if a project was in first series and it was determined that the monies could not be expended within the time frames established for the first series of the bonds, the projects were shifted out. Then the department looked at projects that were in second series that could be done now. Some of the projects were smaller in nature that, in a relatively quick time frame, the projects could be implemented and all of the monies could be spent. Mary Conway, Director, CIP & Transportation, stated that plans and specifications accompany all of the projects that specify how the work is to be performed, and either City staff or industry partner staff provides construction inspection services on every job, making sure that the projects are being built according to those plans and specifications. She requested that the information regarding the fence be forwarded to her for further review.

10. West End Park Building Terrace Remodeling

Tony Sabbag, CIP Department, reported that the existing terrace had about 1,200 square feet of open terrace. The west elevation has been closed in, about 560 square feet. The cost was about \$76,031. Construction began January 9, 2006. The estimated completion date is June 7, 2006. The scope of work consisted of new footings, new concrete block walls, and new windows. There was an added scope from storm panels to accordion shutters for theft protections and for convenience. Also, data cables and additional junction boxes were added in the recreation room. The project was bidded out through the JOC program and pricing was obtained for the project. The project was then awarded and the work proceeded. Only during demolition, extensive, destructive demolition to the facility was it determined that there was extensive termite damage that would only be seen when you tear apart a facility. That resulted in an analysis by the structural engineer that the building could not be renovated for the cost estimated. The issue was

• Tamiami Storm Sewer Improvements – Design Services

David Mendez, Assistant Director, CIP, reported that the project is completed in design, and this is another project that is going through the conventional bid process. Bids should be in by early next month, and construction should begin by mid-year.

Roberto Clemente Park Building Renovation

David Mendez, Assistant Director, CIP, reported that the project scope of work includes a new approximately 10,000 square foot building. In addition to that, there's going to be an enclosed basketball gymnasium. Construction costs are estimated at approximately \$2.6 million. That may go up to about \$3.2 million. Schematic drawings will be presented to the community by the mid-February.

• Fairlawn Storm Water Pump Station - Phase IIA

David Mendez, Assistant Director, CIP, reported that the pump station is located in District 1, on 7th Street, at Antonio Maceo Park, but the majority of the drainage system that collects the water is actually across the street in District 4. It's a two-district project. This project is substantially complete. Punch list items are currently being addressed. The pump is fully functional and ready for the rainy season.

David Mendez, Assistant Director, CIP, reported that the project is just about complete. There were some issues with the electrical connection with FPL. Once that's resolved, the project will be 100 percent complete.

Morningside Park Shoreline Stabilization

David Mendez, Assistant Director, CIP, reported that the project is almost complete. The only item remaining is a kiosk that will serve as an information type of booth. Once that's done next month, the project will be complete. There are also a couple of kayak launches there for people to utilize in the area.

Jose Marti Gym

David Mendez, Assistant Director, CIP, reported that the project should be completed by June 2008. The facility is located right across the street from the Miami Riverside Center.

5. Grand Avenue Lighting

Eileen Broton reported that a portion of the project was previously completed and when funding became available the lighting was added to the project.

6. Miami River Greenways Segments B & C

Eileen Broton reported that Segment B was North River Drive, from Northwest 2nd Street to Flagler; and Segment C is Southwest North River Drive, from Southwest 2nd Avenue to Flagler. Both projects are completed, both came in under budget, and both provided about \$200,000 back.

7. Robert King Park New Building & Site Improvements

Eileen Broton reported that the entire park is being redone, except for the ballpark. The design is 95 percent complete and permitting is close to completion. There is a need for unity of title for the adjacent soccer field. Once this occurs, CIP will try to bid out the projects together. There will be one covered tennis court and one uncovered tennis court. There will be one covered basketball court. There is a \$100,000 shortfall, and this will be funded through other sources. The shortfall is as a result of delays on the project.

Fernando Paiva, Project Manager, reported that the project dry run is in progress. The unity of title issue has to be finalized, and hopefully, it will be completed in the next few months. At the same time, the architects are going to be responding to comments from the Building Department so that the project can go out for bids very soon.

8. Henderson Park New Offices/Restroom Facility

Eileen Broton reported that there were major changes in the scope of the project as a result of community input. The new design will be completed approximately in June of this year and completion of the project is targeted for 2009.

9. City of Miami MMPD Fire Suppressor Modifications

Eileen Broton reported that the communication and emergency operations room and the computer room at the police station have Halon fire suppressor systems and Halon is toxic. This is a project to replace it with an updated system.

David Méndez, Assistant CIP Director, reported that the project is a very unique project. Construction is anticipated to begin November 2008 so that the project begins after the hurricane season ends.

Chairman Flanders stated that the replacement was federally mandated.

10. Paul S. Walker Park

Eileen Broton reported that the project is downtown, across from Starbuck's. There is an existing waterfall feature from a previous use, which will remain.

III. UPDATES:

1. Additional Funding for Dinner Key Dredging/Dinner Key Mitigation

Eileen Broton reported that the project design is complete and the bidding process will begin soon. The mitigation piece of the project was added in the initial cost of the entire project and that permit is forthcoming. There are two components of the project and those two components are separate at this point. CIP proposes to close this project number out and make it into two separate projects with the same number, but designated A and B.

2. Additional Funding for Henderson Park New Offices/Restroom Facility

Eileen Broton reported that the project was previously approved in 2007. The original estimate for the project was very low. The additional items on the project include improvements such as different lighting, landscaping and things that make the project nicer. The project design will be completed very soon and permitting is anticipated in 2009.

3. Additional Funding for Dorsey Park Building Renovation Expansion

Eileen Broton reported that the project scope includes a new gym and a new area for homework and aerobics. The structure is being expanded by approximately 1,000 square feet. The project includes upgraded lighting, the parking area, air conditioning systems and landscaping. The estimated completion of this work is February 2009.

4. Gibson Park Improvements Phase II

Eileen Broton reported that the project was completed. The major challenge on the project was the roof repair. The issue is that the project design had three different types of roofs for different sections so it took a lot of engineering to come up with a proper roof design so that it wouldn't leak. The project also included remodeling of the pool bathhouse, a new multipurpose building and a food prep building. The project came in close to the cost estimate for that phase.

Chairman Flanders reviewed the annual report additions with the Board. The new additions included the Board's project total to date and a paragraph stating that the CIP Department has returned trust to the City and integrity to the process, thus encouraging the City's elected officials to pursue the possibility of offering another bond program, voted by the citizens, that continues the rebuilding of Miami's infrastructure.

III. <u>UPDATES</u>:

1. Additional Funding for Dinner Key Dredging/Dinner Key Mitigation

Eileen Broton reported that the project design is complete and the bidding process will begin soon. The mitigation piece of the project was added in the initial cost of the entire project and that permit is forthcoming. There are two components of the project and those two components are separate at this point. CIP proposes to close this project number out and make it into two separate projects with the same number, but designated A and B.

2. Additional Funding for Henderson Park New Offices/Restroom Facility

Eileen Broton reported that the project was previously approved in 2007. The original estimate for the project was very low. The additional items on the project include improvements such as different lighting, landscaping and things that make the project nicer. The project design will be completed very soon and permitting is anticipated in 2009.

3. Additional Funding for Dorsey Park Building Renovation Expansion

Eileen Broton reported that the project scope includes a new gym and a new area for homework and aerobics. The structure is being expanded by approximately 1,000 square feet. The project includes upgraded lighting, the parking area, air conditioning systems and landscaping. The estimated completion of this work is February 2009.

4. Gibson Park Improvements Phase II

Eileen Broton reported that the project was completed. The major challenge on the project was the roof repair. The issue is that the project design had three different types of roofs for different sections so it took a lot of engineering to come up with a proper roof design so that it wouldn't leak. The project also included remodeling of the pool bathhouse, a new multipurpose building and a food prep building. The project came in close to the cost estimate for that phase.

IV. <u>CHAIRPERSON'S OPEN AGENDA</u>:

Annual Report

Chairman Flanders reviewed the annual report additions with the Board. The new additions included the Board's project total to date and a paragraph stating that the CIP Department has returned trust to the City and integrity to the process, thus encouraging the City's elected officials to pursue the possibility of offering another bond program, voted by the citizens, that continues the rebuilding of Miami's infrastructure.

There will be probably the standard 12 months for design and permitting; probably another 12 to 15 months for construction, depending on how extensive the planned repairs are.

4. Riverside Park Playground Equipment

Ed Blanco, Parks & Recreation, reported that the project is about ready to begin in January. The project was put on hold when the City applied for a grant for the project. An \$80,000 grant was awarded in November 2005. It went to the Commission in December, and a contract was executed in January. The scope of the project has changed. It's a \$270,000 project, which will have handicap walkways and handicap equipment for children in the playground. Construction is estimated to begin in May for an August completion.

III. <u>UPDATES</u>:

1. Additional Funding for Dinner Key Dredging/Dinner Key Mitigation

Eileen Broton reported that the project design is complete and the bidding process will begin soon. The mitigation piece of the project was added in the initial cost of the entire project and that permit is forthcoming. There are two components of the project and those two components are separate at this point. CIP proposes to close this project number out and make it into two separate projects with the same number, but designated A and B.

2. Additional Funding for Henderson Park New Offices/Restroom Facility

Eileen Broton reported that the project was previously approved in 2007. The original estimate for the project was very low. The additional items on the project include improvements such as different lighting, landscaping and things that make the project nicer. The project design will be completed very soon and permitting is anticipated in 2009.

3. Additional Funding for Dorsey Park Building Renovation Expansion

Eileen Broton reported that the project scope includes a new gym and a new area for homework and aerobics. The structure is being expanded by approximately 1,000 square feet. The project includes upgraded lighting, the parking area, air conditioning systems and landscaping. The estimated completion of this work is February 2009.

4. Gibson Park Improvements Phase II

Eileen Broton reported that the project was completed. The major challenge on the project was the roof repair. The issue is that the project design had three different types of roofs for different sections so it took a lot of engineering to come up with a proper roof design so that it wouldn't leak. The project also included remodeling of the pool bathhouse, a new multipurpose building and a food prep building. The project came in close to the cost estimate for that phase.

IV. <u>CHAIRPERSON'S OPEN AGENDA</u>:

Annual Report

Chairman Flanders reviewed the annual report additions with the Board. The new additions included the Board's project total to date and a paragraph stating that the CIP Department has returned trust to the City and integrity to the process, thus encouraging the City's elected officials to pursue the possibility of offering another bond program, voted by the citizens, that continues the rebuilding of Miami's infrastructure.

12, picnic pavilion awnings. This is in the rear of our property. This project's complete, came in \$7 under budget; 100 percent complete, and this is on the north end of our property. Probably our best estimate to date. Lightning protection, \$7,550 was set aside. We only needed to put electric rod on the top of the carousel building. Two other buildings that we were anticipating having to do that work to after we had an analysis done; they were grounded in such a way that it was not needed. That was our administrative modular building and our historic concession stand. And so there was a savings there. Additional parking lot improvements. This was asphalt work again near our front entry. Where you enter a U-turn area, because we had to create a very different vehicular pathway in having folks come in, pay an entry and then whether or not they were at the wrong property and needed to U-turn and head directly out. So there's a section that loops around right at our entryway. That work was completed and there were some cost savings. Awnings for the administrative office, this was literally for our front door and rear door on our modular buildings, so while it's raining just for some coverage. It's an item that we chose later not to go ahead with and we deal with any rain that may come down with an umbrella just out of the front of the office. So it's something that we went ahead and cancelled. Mini train tunnel doors. This is a project that it's ongoing. It's in process right now, purchase orders have gone forward. We got our final bids. These are to replicate the historic cottage style wooden doors for our mini train tunnel. For security for the train because that is where it's parked at night. It's currently locked in with chain-link fence, and we want to complete the historic look of the tunnel and the train. And so that is something that I believe we will have complete in 60 to 90 days. All of the bidding is done and the company has been selected. Mini train rail installation. This included installing the rail, bolts, ties, everything else needed for that process. It did go over our estimate, just over \$25,000. It's 100 percent complete and has begun running as of August last year, the mini train. Mini train painting; that, too, was already complete; did go over, just around \$3,000. And that's project 18. Project 19, mini train platform restoration and awnings. This is the mini train station. What's existing on the park is essentially 110 by 10 foot concrete slab. The covering that was historically there has been gone potentially for decades. We're in the process now, from photographs and historic documents, of replacing that awning. It will be slightly modernized, but it will be very much a replica of what existed there. The company has been selected and actually the design of the awning is done, and in two and a half weeks, they will begin installation. Project number 20, park maintenance facility. This is a project, we cancelled it. Initially, when we brought a concessionaire into our concession stand building, which was a location with some offices where our operations staff used to reside. We were able to move them into our existing modular building. This initially was to put a trailer on property. We were able to not do that, keep some of the historic look of the property and move them into existing buildings, and it has worked out nicely. Finally is the children's play area. This was a boundless playground where we had set aside \$75,000 to match funds coming from the Children's Trust, and at the final hour, the Children's Trust was able to pay for the project 100 percent. And so our \$75,000 in matching was not needed and also went into surplus funds and was 100 percent complete. That concludes my update.

2. Additional Funding for MiaMarina Emergency Repair Pier #5

Eileen Broton reported that the project is another revenue generator for the City. They're requesting \$97,000 of the original approved amount. The project will replace damaged pre-cast concrete stringers, replacement of wood decks with fiberglass and replacing utility services. The contract has already been awarded and construction is anticipated to begin next month with a targeted completion date in late September of '09.

3. Pierce Lance HAZMAT Vehicle for the Fire Department AND

4. Defense and Security Equipment Acquisition

Eileen Broton reported that the item was purchased and put into service in May 2008, and the Board requested information on how often it is used. Item 4, Defense and Security Equipment Acquisition, includes the scuba gear, which will be ordered in May of 2009, and also the training center. The standards for the training center are constantly changing, and the Fire Department is looking for the proper site and trying to see the latest requirements, so this may be on hold until possibly the last quarter of 2009, and we has asked the Fire Department to provide more information for us.

Joe Fernandez, assistant fire chief with the Department of Fire-Rescue, reported that he replaced Chief Duran on the project. The Pierce Lance truck was put in service in May 2008. It was purchased at budget, \$564,577. I do not have an exact number of alarm numbers to date, but I will tell you that this truck does not go out on every single call, kind of like you see the first line pumpers and aerial and rescue trucks. It's a specialized piece of equipment and it goes on certain types of calls when the dispatches come in, whether there's chemical situations, even structural events, and a variety of other specialized scenarios that we might have to respond to. As you know, the previous vehicle was beyond its service life, and the truck really has been a great asset, especially in the midst of everything that we find ourselves under these days, having a vehicle to move around the necessary equipment is very important. So we appreciate your support on it. And if you would like the number of calls that it has responded to since May 29, I can send that to the staff, and they can give it to you via e-mail. Regarding the scuba gear, the equipment here will allow for ten full sets of scuba gear, plus backup equipment to make sure we always have ten sets at the ready to do the services that we aim to do with this equipment. It will be, again, a citywide asset that will be located on the marine unit, and it's of great value, as I said, both for the citizens or visitors that may require services of this type, and for the firefighters themselves, to have the best gear possible to do the job they need to do. I did make a typo here. It was not the staff's fault. If you add the two items, it should come to 899. You see this says 32 as the estimated cost and it's actually 34. So if you add the 34 to the other total, you do get to the 899, but that was my error. This is currently slightly delayed due to a bid issue that the Purchasing Department wanted to do a split bid, I believe. I'm still transitioning with Chief Duran, but it's slightly delayed because of a process in the Purchasing Department, but we do expect to issue a purchase order by March '09 and delivery should be immediately after. This is all equipment, materials that are all readily available. Regarding the training tower, I gave you a sampling here of some photos from the various vendors that might be the actual suppliers of this equipment, and this type of training is not
