Frequently Asked Questions ("FAQ")

Question: Which forms must be included in the bid/proposal at the time of submission?

Answer: The required city forms can be found online under the project solicitation's link at:

www.miamigov.com/capitalImprovements

Use of appropriate city forms depends on the solicitation type (e.g., RFQ, ITB, RFP, etc.).

CBE

Include copies of <u>all</u> applicable prime and sub-consultant CBE certifications which clearly state the certification number in your proposal submittal.

CSBE

Include copies of <u>all</u> applicable prime and sub-contractor CSBE certifications which clearly state the certification number in your Bid Form.

In addition to a dherence to CSBE requirements, all construction contract bidders must hire an independent third party to verify and certify compliance with

- 1) CSBE; and
- 2) LWP requirements in Section III Certifications of the Respective Bid Form.

Certificate of Compliance forms must be included in each proposal and Bid Form submittal. All CSBE M onthly U tilization R eports ("MUR") must be v erified an d certified quarterly by the independent third party. Please see page 5 for details.



Question: My company is a Miami-Dade County certified CBE. Do I need to

allocate fifteen percent (15%) to a different CBE?

Answer: If your company will self-perform at least fifteen percent (15%) of the work required

under the contract, then you will not have to allocate any work to a different CBE in

order to comply with section 18-87 of the City Code.

If y our c ompany will s elf-perform less t han fifteen per cent (15%) of t he w ork required under the contract, then you must allocate to a different CBE an amount of work that, when combined with the work self-performed by your company, will total fifteen percent (15%) of the work required under the contract in or der to comply with section 18-87 of the City Code.

BONUS POINTS: In order to receive the five (5) e valuation bon us points under section 18-87, your proposal must include <u>executed</u> Letters of Agreement ("LOA") which allocate at least fifteen percent (15%) of the work required under the contract to CBE firms who maintain a "local" office, as defined in Section 18-73 of the City Code.

Question: My company is a M iami-Dade County certified CSBE. Do I need to allocate

fifteen percent (15%) to a different CSBE?

Answer: If your company will self-perform at least fifteen percent (15%) of the work required

under the contract, then you will not have to allocate any work to a different CSBE

in order to comply with section 18-89 of the City Code.

If your company will self-perform less than fifteen percent (15%) of the work

required under the contract, then you must allocate to a different CSBE an amount of work that, when combined with the work self-performed by your company, will total fifteen percent (15%) of the work required under the contract in order to

comply with section 18-89 of the City Code.

Question: My company is interested in becoming CSBE certified? Where can I get more

information about its process?

Answer: In order to become CBE or CSBE certified, you must contact Miami Dade County.

Question: My company is a party to a union agreement that require us to utilize the union

labor pool for our recruitment efforts. Are we required to comply with local

workforce participation requirements?

Answer: Yes, unioned and non-unioned companies must comply with the Section 18-89 of

the City Code as it relates to LWP requirements. Here is the link to Municode for

Independent Third Party Verification ("ITPV")

Question: What are the responsibilities of an independent third party who verifies compliance?

Answer: The accuracy of the CSBE and LWP requirements compliance data and reports must be verified and certified on a quarterly basis by a licensed professional under

Title XXXII, Regulation of Professions and Occupations, Florida Statutes 454, 471,

473, or 481 (e.g., a n attorney, pr ofessional eng ineer, pu blic ac countant, or

registered architect).

The Respondent must select an independent third party who verifies and certifies compliance. The independent third party must have a minimum of two (2) years professional experience in contract compliance, auditing, personnel administration, or field experience in payroll, enforcement or investigative environments.

The i ndependent t hird party will be required to verify and certify compliance methods and data and make compliance determinations.

The independent third party will be r equired to sign an affidavit that certifies data submitted by the company is in accurate and in compliance with City Code 18-87 and 18-89.

Question: What does "independent third party" mean?

Answer: Generally speaking, the "independent third party" is not owned in whole or in part by

the Respondent; neither the verifier nor any of its members has a financial interest in the operations, support or c onsulting s ervices t o t he r eporting ent ity. The "independent t hird party" verifier m ust be u naffiliated with the Respondent or its proposed sub-consultants and/or sub-contractors and there must not be a real or

perceived conflict of interest.



Pursuant to Florida Statutes 834.06, whoever knowingly makes a false statement in writing with the intention to mislead a public servant in the performance of their official duty shall be guilty of a misdemeanor of the second degree, punishable as provided in F.S. 755.082, F.S. 755.083 and F.S. 755.084.

Question: Who pays its cost?

Answer: The cost as sociated with CSBE and LWP compliance must be factored into the

overall cost of the project.

Question: My firm is interested in submitting a proposal for an advertised Request for

Qualifications? Will we be required to go through the ITPV process?

Answer: No. However, if awarded an agreement, the Respondent will be required to sign

affidavits and certify reports that require CBE compliance.

Question: My company is interested in submitting a proposal for an advertised design-build

project? Will we be required to go through the ITPV process?

Answer: Yes. Respondents will be required to c omply with C BE, CSBE and L WP

requirements as stipulated in both Sections 18-87 and 18-89 of the City of Miami

code.

a) The CBE component will require the Respondent to certify monthly reports.

b) The CSBE and LWP component requires quarterly reporting including ITPV

and certification.

Question: At w hat t ime a m I r equired to identify t he n ame of t he c ompany who will be

responsible for ITPV?

Answer: The independent third party must be listed on Form SU (for construction

solicitations) and/or Form C-1 (for A/E solicitations).

The designated independent t hird p arty is <u>not</u> required t o h ave CBE/CSBE certification. However, the firm and/or individual must be listed on Form SU and/or

Form C-1 at the time of bid/proposal submittal.



Why would an architectural and/or engineering firm need to list an independent third Question:

Design-Build Respondents will be r equired to us e Miami-Dade C ounty certified Answer:

> CBEs AND Miami-Dade County certified CSBEs; therefore Respondents will be required to lis t CB Es ub-consultant(s), CSBEs ub-contractor(s) AND the independent third party as a sub-consultant on the required forms included in its

proposal.
