



MIAMI MARINE FLEX-PARK RFQ

Miami Marine Stadium was built in 1963, and is situated on scenic Virginia Key. It is considered a singular and distinctive example of a civic mid-century modem marine structure. Despite hosting a wide variety of events and performances throughout its history, it currently sits unused.



After Hurricane Andrew in 1992, the stadium was declared an unsafe structure and was abandoned. It became a haven for graffiti artists and taggers, creating the unique aesthetic that currently adorns the structure. The land around the stadium hosts regular large-scale event and races.

On July 22, 2010, the City of Miami completed a master plan for Virginia Key that included flexible open space on the eastern side of Marine Stadium. Contained within this report is a strategy to turn this flexible open space into a distinctive and memorable place with regional importance. A place suitable for individual recreation, or massive congregation. A place worthy of Miami.
