6/7/2016	<i>“Fast-track Development of Freeboard Ordinance”</i>	A MOTION OF THE SEA LEVE RISE COMMITTEE (“SLRC”) TO INITIATE A FAST-TRACK PROCESS TO DEVELOP AND ESTABLISH A FREEBOARD ORDINANCE THAT WOULD INCLUDE; ALLOWING FOR INDIVIDUAL BUILDINGS TO BE ELEVATED IN CERTAIN AREAS IN RELATION TO FEMA BASE FLOOD ELEVATIONS, WHERE BUIDLINGS MEET THE GROUND	Passed

- Staff to develop a clear scope of work RFQ to retain the economic risk modeling expertise/cost of inaction analysis etc.
- Developing/expediting coastal infrastructure standards and design guidelines
