ASSIGNMENT AGREEMENT

FIRE PREVENTION BUREAU

- This Agreement supersedes any prior Fire Prevention Bureau Assignment Agreement going.
- This agreement shall be utilized in assigning IAFF 587 bargaining unit members to positions specified within this agreement. There are some positions, specifically New Construction Inspector, Specialty Inspector and District Inspector, which either civilian employees or firefighters are eligible to fill. This agreement shall not apply to civilians when they are assigned to these specific positions.
- It is the intent of the parties that the overriding criteria for assignments in the Fire Prevention Bureau (FPB) shall be departmental seniority. However, the parties acknowledge that some positions within the FPB are specialized and require a certain amount of education and/or FPB experience.
- The L/M Committee will be made up of three (3) representatives from Management and three (3) representatives from Labor. Time extensions requests beyond the established timeframes for purposes of obtaining certification requirements shall only be granted by a majority vote of the L/M Committee.
- Where applicable within this agreement "Fire Prevention Bureau (FPB) experience" is defined as any time (past and/or present) a member has been assigned in a permanent bid position within the FPB. Temporary and/or Light Duty assignments DO NOT qualify towards (FPB) experience.

DEPUTY FIRE MARSHAL

- 1. Fire Captain
- 2. Must have or obtain a State of Florida Fire Inspector certification within one year of the assignment. Members may be given a onetime extension beyond the year of assignment if they are waiting to take any portion of the required education and/or the State of Florida certification examination. In order to obtain an extension, the member must petition the Department's Labor Management (L/M) Committee for approval and demonstrate that the delay was either beyond his/her control or was due to some significant and unavoidable event.



- 1. Position(s) advertised for a minimum of 15 days
- 2. The Deputy Fire Marshal position shall be selected from those Fire Captains that bid from the following priority groups (Priority Group A having the highest priority). If there are two or more members in the appropriate priority group, the Assistant Fire Chief in charge of the FPB (Fire Marshal) shall select from within that priority group.

If they fail to become certified within this time period their position shall be advertised and filled according to #2 above, unless they are granted an extension by the Department's L/M Committee.
- 4. If no Fire Captain bids for the position the least senior Fire Captain that is a State Certified Fire Inspector shall be assigned. The position shall be considered a vacancy and can be bid on by any other Fire Captain in the future. The Drafted Captain shall remain in the assignment until one of the following occurs.

a) A Fire Captain bids into the vacancy

b) A more Junior Fire Captain that is a State Certified Fire Inspector is (drafted) assigned.

Members will retain the prevailing benefits currently enjoyed with this assignment.

ASSISTANT TO THE FIRE MARSHAL

Qualifications:

- 1. Firefighter
- 2. Must have or obtain a State of Florida Fire Inspector certification within one year of assignment. Members may be given a onetime extension beyond the year of assignment if they are waiting to take any portion of the required education and/or the State of Florida certification examination. In order to obtain an extension, the member must petition the Department's Labor Management (L/M) Committee for approval and demonstrate that the delay was either beyond his/her control or was due to some significant and unavoidable event.

Selection process:

- 1. Position(s) advertised for a minimum of 15 days
- 2. The Assistant to the Fire Marshal position shall be selected from those Firefighters that bid from the following priority groups (Priority Group A having the highest priority). If there are two or more members in the appropriate priority group, the Assistant Fire Chief in charge of the FPB (Fire Marshal) shall select from within that priority group.

ASSISTANT FIRE MARSHAL (Water Officer / Hazardous Materials Inspector)

- 2. Must have or obtain a State of Florida Fire Inspector certification within one year of assignment. Members may be given a onetime extension beyond the year of assignment if they are waiting to take any portion of the required education and/or the State of Florida certification examination. In order to obtain an extension, the member must petition the Department's Labor Management (L/M) Committee for approval and demonstrate that the delay was either beyond his/her control or was due to some significant and unavoidable event.



- 1. Position(s) advertised for a minimum of 15 days
- 2. The Assistant Fire Marshal position shall be selected from those permanent Fire Lieutenants that bid from the following priority groups (Priority Group A having the highest priority). If there are two or more members in the highest priority group, the Fire Lieutenant with the highest seniority in grade will be awarded the position.




